

The Rabbits' Eye View - Understanding Long-term Plant Performance and descriptive blurb

How long will plants survive? Will they spread? Will they seed? This full-day workshop aims at encouraging participants to observe garden and landscape plants, primarily but not exclusively perennials, focussing on their growth through the year, looking at how they compete with each other, how to assess prospects for their longevity and their suitability for a variety of garden locations. Practitioners can then use their experience and knowledge of plants to plan for appropriate levels of maintenance and in particular to plan for the long-term – important for financial sustainability. Integral to the day is to get participants thinking about how plants are linked to their natural habitats and ecology and how this connects to the way we use them in gardens and landscapes. Encouraged to get down on hands and knees to get 'the rabbit's eye view', close observation of plant growing habits and lifecycles through the year can greatly empower us as professionals.





KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Internationally renowned writer, lecturer and planting design consultant, Dr Noel Kingsbury is an authority on naturalistic and ecological approaches to planting design. He works as a planting design consultant for landscape companies, local government and private garden owners. Key to Noel's approach to planting is research and its dissemination through journalism, books and workshops. Noel is passionate that gardening is a gateway to the higher intellectual world and has written over 25 books including co-authorships with the celebrated Dutch master of perennial planting, Piet Oudolf. At the heart of this is his work on the long-term performance of plants in gardens and designed landscapes.
